1 John 1:1-3 (NIV) The idea of community comes from God.

Connectedness is not the same thing as knowing many people. People may have many contacts in many networks, but they may not have any friends. – John Ortberg, "The Me I Want To Be"

1. I need others to walk with me. (1 John 1:5-7)

- Walking in the light means *vulnerability*.
- *Fellowship* is created when we share vulnerability.
- The blood of Jesus is applied best in <u>community</u>.

Community is God's answer to *lonliness*.

2. I need others to watch out for me. (1 John 2:9-11)

- <u>Safety</u> "In the multitude of counselors, there is safety." (Pr. 11:14)
- <u>Support</u> "When you run alone, you run fast! When you run together, you run far!" African Proverb
- Smarts "All of us are smarter than one of us."

Community is God's answer to *defeat*.

3. I need others to work with me in a *crisis*. (1 John 3:16-19)

- We show each other who God is when we love each other.
- The best time to prepare for a crisis is <u>yesterday</u>.

Community is God's answer to despair.



4. I need others to win the war of fear. (1 John 4:18-21)

• The antidote for fear is not faith...it's *love*.

Community is God's answer to *anxiety*.

(1 John 5:2-5)
